## **307.53 (F98.21) Rumination Disorder**

## **307.59 (F50.89) Avoidant/Restrictive Food Intake Disorder (ARFID)**

### **307.1 Anorexia Nervosa (AN)**

*Subtypes:* **(F50.01)** Restricting Type  
**(F50.02)** Binge-Eating/Purging Type

*Clarifiers:* In Partial Remission  
In Full Remission

*Severity:* Based on BMI (*adults*) or BMI percentile (*children/adolescents*), clinical symptoms, degree of functional disability, and need for supervision: *Mild, Moderate, Severe, Extreme*

### **307.51 (F50.2) Bulimia Nervosa (BN)**

*Clarifiers:* In Partial Remission  
In Full Remission

*Severity:* Based on number of compensatory behaviors in a week, other symptoms, and degree of functional disability: *Mild, Moderate, Severe, Extreme*

### **307.51 (F50.81) Binge-Eating Disorder (BED)**

*Clarifiers:* In Partial Remission  
In Full Remission

*Severity:* Based on number of binge eating episodes in a week, other symptoms, and degree of functional disability: *Mild, Moderate, Severe, Extreme*

### **307.59 (F50.89) Other Specified Feeding or Eating Disorder (OSFED)**

*Examples:* Atypical Anorexia Nervosa  
Bulimia Nervosa (*low frequency or limited duration*)  
Binge-Eating Disorder (*low frequency or limited duration*)  
Purging Disorder  
Night Eating Syndrome
